Multi-Year Phased Evidence Management System Development



Brondolo Associates was tasked by the City of New Haven to review the operations of the Evidence and Property collection process for its Department of Police Services. Brondolo Associates provided guidance for policy and procedural changes designed to improve the efficiency of the operation. This involved re-engineering the management systems for evidence and property. The processes included a needs analysis, systems development, and implementation, which included relocation of over 50,000 items of evidence, examination of accessioning process of evidence items, facility renovation, training, and auditing.

Initial steps included illustration of the processes and mandates that drive activities. These were visualized through systems-level detailed planning schematics. Analysis then included model storage capacities of the evidence and property storeroom and examination of available space and storage options for reorganization.

This multi-phased, multi-year project used the interdisciplinary expertise at Brondolo Associates. The consulting team delivered an improved spatial, legal, and technical framework for managing the complex challenges facing inventory management.
